President Trump Finally Ends the Madness of NPR, PBS

Last night, President Donald J. Trump <u>signed an executive order</u> ending the taxpayer subsidization of National Public Radio (NPR) and the Public Broadcasting Service (PBS) — entities that receive tens of millions of dollars in taxpayer funds each year to spread radical, woke propaganda disguised as "news."

## Here are some examples of the trash that has passed for "news" at NPR and PBS:

- NPR <u>ran a story</u> titled "Cannibalism: It's 'Perfectly Natural," in which an author described eating another human's placenta: "It was really the prep that made it taste good. Granted, the [husband] was a chef and so he knew how to prepare it osso bucco style and used a really nice wine I had brought. It smelled great. It didn't taste bad."
- In 2021, NPR <u>declared</u> the Declaration of Independence to be a document with "flaws and deeply ingrained hypocrisies."
  - In 2022, NPR <u>scrapped</u> its decades-long Independence Day tradition of reading the Declaration of Independence on air to instead <u>discuss</u> "<u>equality</u>."
  - NPR subsequently <u>issued</u> an "editor's note" warning the Declaration of Independence is "a document that contains offensive language."
- NPR <u>apologized</u> for calling illegal immigrants "<u>illegal</u>."
- NPR <u>sounded the alarm</u> about young men who <u>abstain</u> from masturbating to pornography.
- NPR <u>featured</u> a Valentine's Day story centered around "queer animals," in which it suggested the make-believe clownfish in "Finding Nemo" would've been better off

as a female, that "banana slugs are hermaphrodites," and that "some deer are nonbinary."


- PBS devoted a panel to what it "mean[s] to be woke" and "white privilege."
- NPR <u>routinely promotes</u> the chemical and surgical mutilation of children as socalled "gender-affirming care" without mentioning the irreversible <u>damage</u> caused by these procedures.
- In 2021, a PBS station <u>aired</u> a "children's program" that featured a drag queen named "Lil' Miss Hot Mess."
- NPR <u>educated</u> the nation on the "whole community of genderqueer dinosaur enthusiasts" and "trans-ceratops."
- Then-PBS White House Correspondent Yamiche Alcindor <u>characterized</u> President Trump's patriotic 2020 Mount Rushmore speech as a love letter to "<u>white</u> <u>resentment</u>" that promoted the "myth of America."
- NPR <u>reported</u> on the "cousin of diet culture" known as "healthism, which is the idea
  that we have to be healthy" as if that was a bad thing.
- NPR <u>assigned</u> three reporters to investigate how the thumbs-up emoji is racist.
- NPR <u>suggested</u> doorway sizes are based on "latent fatphobia."
- PBS <u>produced an entire movie</u> celebrating a transgender teenager's so-called "changing gender identity."
- NPR absurdly <u>claimed</u> "limited scientific evidence of physical advantage" exists between male and female athletes.
- NPR <u>lamented</u> that "animals deserve pronouns, too."
- NPR <u>ran a feature</u> titled "What 'Queer Ducks' can teach teenagers about sexuality in the animal kingdom."
- In 2023, PBS's *Washington Week* roundtable covered up Joe Biden's clear mental decline, with far-left "journalist" Jeffrey Goldberg <u>claiming</u> Biden was actually "<u>quite acute.</u>"
- NPR <u>dedicated</u> an entire segment to the "population of anthropomorphic animal enthusiasts known as 'furries.'"

- PBS <u>produced</u> a documentary making the case for reparations.
- NPR disparagingly <u>referred</u> to pro-life Americans at the March for Life as "antiabortion rights activists."
- NPR <u>explored</u> "the racial origins of fat phobia."
- NPR management <u>asked</u> its editors to avoid the term "biological sex" when discussing transgender issues.
- PBS show Sesame Street <u>partnered</u> with CNN on a one-sided narrative to "address racism" amid the Black Lives Matter riots.

# NPR and PBS have zero tolerance for non-leftist viewpoints:

- In 2020, NPR refused to cover the <u>explosive</u> Hunter Biden laptop scandal in the runup to the election, baselessly <u>claiming</u> its "assertions don't amount to much" and <u>writing</u> they "don't want to waste the listeners' and readers' time on stories that are just pure distractions."
- When a 25-year veteran NPR reporter and editor <u>spoke out</u> about the network's obsession with liberal causes, they <u>suspended</u> him.
  - The editor <u>found</u> that registered Democrats outnumbered Republicans 87 to zero in their newsroom.
  - NPR prolifically reported on the Russian collusion hoax, with the editor <u>describing</u> "[Adam] Schiff talking points" as "the drumbeat of NPR news reports."
- NPR CEO Katherine Maher once <u>called</u> President Trump "racist," <u>shared</u> a photo of herself wearing a "Biden for President" campaign hat, <u>serves</u> on the board of a Soros-funded activist group, and <u>described</u> "reverence for the truth" as a "distraction."
- In 2023, a study <u>found</u> that congressional Republicans saw 85% negative coverage while congressional Democrats saw 54% positive coverage on PBS's flagship news program.
- According to a <u>2024 study</u>, PBS news staff used 162 variations of the term "farright," but only six variations of "far-left."

- Media bias rating agency AllBias which surveyed nearly 24,000 readers
   <u>found NPR's bias aligns with "liberal, progressive or left-wing thought and/or policy agendas."</u>
- NPR repeatedly dismissed the theory that COVID-19 originated in a lab a
  conclusion now deemed likely by the <u>FBI</u>, <u>CIA</u>, and <u>Department of Energy</u>.
  - April 2020: "Scientists Debunk Lab Accident Theory Of Pandemic Emergence"
  - May 2020: "As Trump Pushes Theory Of Virus Origins, Some See Parallels In Lead-Up To Iraq War"
  - May 2021: "Many Scientists Still Think The Coronavirus Came From Nature"
  - March 2023: "Virologist says COVID origin report could make it harder to study dangerous diseases"
  - <u>September 2024</u>: "New research points to raccoon dogs in Wuhan market as pandemic trigger. It's controversial"
- A 2024 Media Research Center <u>study</u> found that PBS's coverage of the Republican National Convention was 72% negative, while coverage of the Democratic National Convention was 88% positive.
