We'll Never Tire of Winning Under President Trump

The winning never stops as President Donald J. Trump and his administration continue to make progress reversing the damage of the past four years and shepherding the country into its new Golden Age.

Here is a non-comprehensive list of wins for the American people in week seven:

- Illegal border crossings in February <u>fell</u> to the lowest level ever recorded, <u>down</u> <u>94%</u> from last February and <u>down 96%</u> from the all-time high of the Biden Administration.
 - o Illegal immigrant encounters at the Del Rio Sector <u>declined 99%</u> over 2023.
 - Fox News Correspondent Bill Melugin: "If Fox were to send me down there
 right now, I would have trouble finding a single migrant on camera."
- The Trump Administration <u>arrested</u> two illegal immigrants accused of running one of the largest human smuggling rings in the United States.
- President Trump <u>announced</u> manufacturing is back after the U.S. <u>gained</u> 10,000 manufacturing jobs in President Trump's first full month in office a swift turnaround after losing an average of 9,000 manufacturing jobs per month in the final year of the Biden Administration.
 - The rebound in manufacturing jobs was led by the auto sector, which gained nearly 9,000 new jobs in February — the most in 15 months — after losing 27,300 auto jobs in Biden's final year.
 - U.S. manufacturing <u>expanded</u> at its fastest pace since mid-2022 in February, marking the second straight month of expansion under President Trump.
- President Trump continued securing historic investments in America.

- President Trump <u>announced</u> a \$100 billion investment by Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Company (TSMC) in its Arizona-based semiconductor chips manufacturing operation — the largest foreign direct investment in U.S. history.
- President Trump <u>announced</u> shipping giant CMA CGM will invest \$20 billion in U.S. shipping and logistics, which will create 10,000 new American jobs days after President Trump <u>pledged</u> to make American shipbuilding great again and announced a new White House Office of Shipbuilding to spearhead the effort.
- The Trump Administration <u>announced</u> an \$18 billion investment by American liquefied natural gas (LNG) exporter Venture Global into their Plaquemines LNG export facility — made possible by President Trump's energy policies.
- Siemens <u>announced</u> a \$285 million investment in U.S. electrical product manufacturing, which will create more than 900 new skilled manufacturing jobs.
- Wisconsin-based Clarios, a leader in low-voltage energy storage, <u>announced</u> a \$6 billion plan to expand its U.S.-based manufacturing.
- Honda <u>announced</u> it will produce its next-generation Civic in Indiana, rather than Mexico, as a result of President Trump's tariffs.
- Automaker Stellantis <u>pledged</u> to build more vehicles in America.
- Average 30-year fixed mortgage rates <u>fell</u> for a seventh straight week posting the biggest weekly drop since mid-September.
- A new study found President Trump's deregulation efforts since taking office have saved Americans \$180 billion or \$2,100 in savings for a family of four.
- President Trump signed an <u>executive order</u> to increase American timber production and <u>launched</u> an investigation into the national security threat posed by dependence on foreign timber.
- President Trump <u>established</u> the Strategic Bitcoin Reserve and U.S. Digital Asset Stockpile to position America as the global leader in cryptocurrency.

- The Trump Administration <u>suspended</u> enforcement of invasive, burdensome reporting requirements that saddled small businesses with unnecessary red tape.
 - National Federation of Independent Business: "NFIB greatly appreciates President Trump's strong support in this important effort to protect America's Small Business owners from what he correctly labeled an 'outrageous and invasive' Beneficial Ownership Information (BOI) reporting requirement... We thank President Trump and his administration for their willingness to stand up for small businesses and address the Beneficial Ownership Information reporting rule."
- The Department of Energy <u>approved</u> an LNG permit extension for Golden Pass LNG Terminal in Texas — the second LNG approval since President Trump took office and immediately <u>reversed</u> the Biden Administration's LNG export ban.
- President Trump <u>continued</u> using tariffs to force Mexico, Canada, and China to crack down on deadly fentanyl and other drugs trafficked across our borders.
 - President Trump <u>added</u> an additional 10% tariff on all Chinese imports.
 - The United Auto Workers (UAW) <u>praised</u> the tariffs, calling them necessary to end the "free trade disaster that has dropped like a bomb on the working class."
- The Trump Administration <u>apprehended</u> Mohammad "Jafar" Sharifullah, the ISIS-K terrorist who orchestrated the attack at Abbey Gate, Afghanistan — which claimed the lives of 13 heroic U.S. service members.
- The Department of State formally <u>designated</u> the Iran-backed Houthis, who are responsible for hundreds of attacks on commercial vessels and U.S. service members, as a Foreign Terrorist Organization following President Trump's <u>executive order</u> earlier this year.
- The Trump Administration announced visa restrictions on <u>foreign officials</u> who facilitate illegal immigration into the United States and <u>international students</u> linked to terrorist organizations, including Hamas.
 - The Department of State <u>revoked</u> the first visa of a foreign student linked to "Hamas-supporting disruptions."

- The Trump Administration <u>expedited</u> the delivery of \$4 billion in military assistance to Israel.
- CK Hutchison Holding <u>sold</u> ports operating on both sides of the Panama Canal to a U.S.-based consortium, effectively placing the ports back in American control.
- The Trump Administration <u>strengthened</u> U.S. counterterrorism efforts by changing rules on military raids and airstrikes.
- The Department of Defense <u>renamed</u> Fort Moore, Georgia, as "Fort Benning" in honor of World War I hero Army Cpl. Fred G. Benning.
- President Trump <u>designated</u> English as the official language of the United States.
- President Trump <u>renamed</u> the Anahuac National Wildlife Refuge in memory of 12year-old Jocelyn Nungaray, who was brutally murdered by two illegal immigrants released into the country by the Biden Administration.
- An inspector general "<u>filed</u> a legal brief arguing that Trump is well within his executive powers to fire him and the 16 other U.S. inspectors general."
- The Trump Administration <u>canceled</u> \$400 million in federal grants to Columbia
 University over their <u>inaction</u> to protect Jewish students from anti-Semitism and <u>announced</u> additional actions to end the scourge of anti-Semitism on college campuses.
- The Small Business Administration <u>implemented</u> a series of reforms to put
 American citizens first including requiring citizenship verification on loan
 applications and <u>relocating</u> offices out of so-called "sanctuary cities."
- The Trump Administration <u>reopened</u> a section of Interstate 40 between North Carolina and Tennessee, which had been destroyed during Hurricane Helene, <u>three times faster and cheaper</u> than expected.
- President Trump's historic address to a joint session of Congress received wide acclaim.
 - o 76% of viewers <u>approved</u> of the speech.
 - The address <u>received</u> 36.6 million viewers almost <u>ten million</u> more viewers than Biden's joint address in 2021.

- The Trump Administration <u>launched</u> a new tool to detail conflicts of interest among current and past members of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's vaccine advisory committee.
- The Environmental Protection Agency <u>canceled</u> additional wasteful grants, saving taxpayers more than \$116 million and bringing the EPA's <u>total savings</u> to \$287 million.
- The Department of Veterans Affairs redirected \$900 million in savings back to health care, benefits, and services for VA beneficiaries by <u>terminating</u> non-mission-critical or duplicative contracts.
- The Department of the Interior <u>announced</u> a new ten-year lease with Williams
 Transco for continued critical energy infrastructure in New York City at a site
 that had been used to house illegal immigrants during the Biden Administration.
- Secretary of Education Linda McMahon was <u>confirmed</u> by the Senate, continuing the historic pace at which President Trump's cabinet is filled.
- The Trump Administration <u>extended</u> foreclosure relief for Californians impacted by the Los Angeles County wildfires.
- President Trump <u>restored</u> the integrity of the Public Service Loan Forgiveness Program.
- President Trump <u>established</u> the White House Task Force on the FIFA World Cup 2026 as the country prepares to host the sporting world's crown jewel event.
- President Trump proclaimed March as <u>Women's History Month</u> and <u>Irish-American</u> <u>Heritage Month</u>.
